The Winooski NRCD has been offering its Annual Conservation Tree Sale for 26 years. We are committed to offering this sale to promote the planting of native trees and shrubs throughout Vermont's landscape. Furthermore, it is a fundraiser for the Winooski NRCD. The money that we make on the Tree Sale allows us to bring workshops, educational information, and high-quality conservation programs to the people in our District. Orders must be postmarked by Friday, March 27th, 2009.

Limited quantities are available. Order Early! Orders will be processed First Come, First Serve.

All orders must be picked up on Saturday, May 2nd, 2009 between 9am and Noon in Williston or Berlin.

At the Tree Sale, all trees (except the conifers) will come as bare root. Bare root means that the plants are dug and stored without any soil around their roots.

What are the advantages of planting bare root trees?

- More root mass. Bare root trees can have up to 200% more roots than container trees, depending on the soil and transplanting history at the nursery.
- Lower cost. Without extra labor and materials, bare root trees cost both the seller and buyer less.
- **Easier planting.** A young tree without soil weighs little, so it's easy to move and plant.

There must be some disadvantages!

- Less flexibility. Once they leave the nursery, bare root trees need to get in the ground within a week. Without soil, the roots can dry out and die if left exposed for a long period of time.
- Narrower planting window. Bare root trees need

- good soil moisture, so mid spring (before budbreak) and mid fall (after leaf fall) are the only two possible planting times.
- **Restricted availability**. Some species may not be available bare root, and some nurseries may not have trees available for bare root retail sale at all.

Other bare root tips and techniques:

- Use any technique you can to reduce the time the tree roots are bare.
- Have fall trees dug mid-October to late November, spring trees late March to early May.
- If possible, dip tree roots in a slurry of a *hydrogel* (a synthetic water-absorbing compound, many brands available) or muddy water, then store them in large, plastic bags until planting.
- Keep trees covered, shaded, and moist until actually put in the ground.

WHAT'S NEW IN THE WATERSHED?

Browns River Corridor Plan

Eroding streambanks, lack of forest riparian buffers, and associated land use and water quality conflicts concerning the state's surface waters occur in every watershed. The Browns River watershed, encompassing most of Underhill, Jericho, Essex, Westford and a portion of Fairfax, are approaching solutions to these water quality issues systematically.

The Winooski NRCD, VT Department of Environmental Conservation, and Arrowwood Environmental (a consulting company based in Huntington, VT) are developing a River Corridor Plan for the watershed and its communities. This watershed-wide plan will encompass all the physical stream assessment data collected from within the watershed since 2004 and prioritize local restoration projects on private and municipal properties. This plan will be available to Towns and landowners in February 2009.

Some conservation efforts have occurred within the Browns River watershed over the past three years, to unify water quality improvement and community education. In 2008, Essex Technical Center and Colchester High School students planted over 540 plants at

two sites along the Browns River in Underhill and Westford.

Discussions are currently underway with Browns River landowners to: plant trees and shrubs on public land and farms this spring; establish river corridor easements on agricultural land; explore wetland restoration projects; and hold two pasture management and

water quality related workshops on farms within the watershed.

Watershed Steering Committee meetings will be held throughout 2009 to establish conservation priorities and review the recommendations laid out in the River Corridor Plan.
