Stormwater Mitigation & Outreach and Education

The WNRCD involves school-aged students in addressing stormwater on their school grounds through project development, implementation, and education and outreach.

Let it Rain-Soak it for Schools- Connects children to stormwater through understanding their watershed and energize them to become leaders of change. The WNRCD has created a free toolkit for schools and educators to use called Soak it for Schools. The WNRCD is seeking funding to further develop the toolkit and to initiate a mentor program with high school students to allow them to in turn educate other youth.



School Stormwater Mitigation- The WNRCD

works with local schools on project identification, grant writing, and project implementation to reduce stormwater impacts as well as to increase student awareness and involvement. Current projects being considered included schools within Waterbury and Colchester.

Fish Habitat Protection and Restoration

Aquatic Organism Passage- In Vermont, many species of fish and wildlife utilize streams, wetlands and adjacent riparian lands. The WNRCD works to address the impacts of dams and poorly designed, and ill-functioning stream crossings that hinder aquatic organism passage in addition to increasing sediment and phosphorus loading to local waterways.



In an effort to address these issue, WNRCD identifies areas where passage may be hindered and works with towns and road crews to make necessary changes to the offending structure (typically perched culverts). Leveraging various funding sources, WNRCD is then able to secure designs and financial assistance for either replacements or retrofits. Current AOP projects are underway focusing on native trout habitat and naturally reproducing salmon habitat.

Riparian Buffer Installation- The WNRCD implemented a project aimed at improving streamside riparian buffers throughout the Winooski River watershed. Through the Trees for Streams program this project has grown and expanded. Riparian buffers are an important component of the ecosystem of a river and serve many functions, from pollutant



mitigation to stream bank stabilization, fish habitat and flood plane resiliency. The WNRCD works with property owners, and State and Federal Agencies to implement valuable riparian buffer restoration projects. Water Quality Monitoring and Project Assessment

Water Quality Assessment– The WNRCD works with citizen scientists to undertake the monitoring of bodies of water for water quality impacts. Data collected is utilized to prioritize projects, planning at a watershed scale and for targeted outreach and education. Funding is sought to purchase equipment needed to monitor flow, turbidity, chlorides and to be able to assist towns with the cost of laboratory analysis for testing associated with



phosphorus, nitrogen and chlorides. By involving the citizens in the collection of the samples, and through targeted outreach, we create a vested interest and commitment in the protection and enhancement of our water resources.

A Sampling of Current and Proposed WNRCD Projects

Agricultural Assistance

The WNRCD is committed to providing agricultural producers with the technical, financial, and educational resources they need to be exceptional stewards of the Vermont landscape.

Agricultural Outreach Initiative- The WNRCD continues to grow our Agricultural Outreach Initiative. Programs are continually developed to assist small farms to take the steps necessary to develop a Nutrient Management Plans (NMP) and understand the changes to the Required Agricultural Practices.

Urban Agricultural Initiative- The WNRCD has initiated a program to provide assistance to urban farms, including school gardens, roof top gardens, and community gardens. We strive to connect the public with resources and serve those located in food deserts.

Horse Manure Composting- The WNRCD work with horse owners within the District to improve water quality conditions by preventing manure and manure runoff from entering local waterways. The WNRCD is seeking additional funding to work with horse owners to identify suitable locations to store manure and to compost manure that are both

environmentally friendly and convenient for the landowner.



The WNRCD is a strong advocate of sustainable forestry practices, and work to ensure that Vermont's forest land resources retain their economic, social, and ecological benefits.


